Dear Fiends,

Just over a year ago now I organised our Parish Eucharist Booklets to be printed with a new format and new content. I have received a lot of positive comment about a prayer I used as the invitation to come and receive Communion. Hooe PCC asked if I could write something in the Parish Magazine about welcoming people to receive Communion. I therefore include the words of that prayer as an introduction to what I want to say this month:

"This is the Table, not of the church, but of the Lord. It is made ready for those who love Him and for those who want to love Him more. So come, You who have much faith and You who have little, You who have been here often and You who have not been here long, You who have tried to follow and you who have failed. Come, not because it is I who invites you, it is our Lord, it is Christ and he invites you to meet him here. "

I believe that says exactly what I want to say about the importance of Holy Communion and our invitation to receive it. The Eucharist (Holy Communion) is the family meal of the church and it is the only command our Lord gave to us to 'Do this in remembrance of me'. It is therefore a central activity of the worship of the Church and as such it should include all who wish to be part of that family activity. At the family meal around our table at home we would never exclude anyone from joining us around the table and the same should be true for the church. All are welcome!

Confirmation is an important ceremony within the life of the church, but it is not in itself a means to receive Holy Communion. Confirmation is taking your promises made at Baptism for yourself. To receive communion or not is simply between yourselves and God and I am sure our Lord would never exclude anyone!

My main thrust in the work I do with the two villages is that the church and our Lord are welcoming, no one is ever turned away and not only that, they are welcome with open arms. I therefore look forward to welcoming you to share in our Lords family meal and maybe

also to welcome you to confirmation. I am very happy to arrange confirmation classes at any time but don't be worried, they are not a long list of teachings about the faith, they are an exploration of faith that we share together so that we learn together. In the meantime, it will soon be the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday on 6th March and that is an opportunity to deepen our own faith and to remember that in church it is our Lord, it is Christ who invites you to meet him there!

OUR SCHOOL

The end is in sight: We will be moving into our new classrooms on 25th March after which the old ones will be safely demolished and the rest of the site work completed, hopefully by the end of May.

This month we've been tackling some of the effects of modern life and technology on our children. In support of 'Children's Mental Health week' we ran a number of workshops for the children covering emotions and feelings and how we each deal with those in different ways. The highlight of the week was a whole school rotation day when children took part in seven different sessions, each based in a different part of the school. This meant that the groups had to move between locations rather than be based in one classroom all day. Even this change to the daily routine threw up a few surprises in how different children cope with change. The individual sessions covered such diverse topics as: Keeping physically active; Guided meditation; Yoga; Managing your emotions; Talking about your feelings and Recycling. I joined in with three of the sessions and I was very impressed with the level of interaction and understanding, even by the very young children.

If you've read any of the recent press on this you will have seen the high levels of anxiety that are present in our children these days and some of the disturbing consequences, so anything that can be done to mitigate this has to be good.

It was also 'National Safer Internet day' and so we have been running workshops for the Parents as well as the children on how to stay safe online. Parents have a big responsibility in this and yet it is the children who tend to be more technology aware, so it is important that both are fully involved and understand the potential dangers of being online. The aim is to teach the three R's of digital citizenship: Risk, Reputation and Responsibility.

Education seems to have come a long way since the three R's I was taught (Reading, wRiting and aRithmatic) so to bring it back to basics I'd like to quote you some parts of a letter we recently received from the Department of Education:

Dear Mr Brown,

We would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on the very high standard of achievement demonstrated in the writing and mathematics Key Stage 2 assessments last year.

Your schools results show that 100% of your pupils reached or exceeded the expected standard in writing and mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2. This means that for writing and mathematics your school is in the top 1% of primary schools in England.

Not a bad result for a small rural school in East Sussex!

We welcomed 16 members of the public to the February Meeting including some new faces which was really great too see.

We heard an update on the Wealden Local Plan which was submitted for examination on 18th January 2019. Wealden District Council has made some minor changes to the submission plan which can be seen on their website. They have requested that the plan be examined at the beginning of March but we will have to wait and see when the Inspector timetables this. Ninfield Parish Council will be working hard to meet with the inspector at the appropriate meetings to discuss our representation to the plan. As Wealden District receive correspondence from the planning inspector they will make it available on their website. We will do our best to keep you updated.

The Parish Councillors discussed the possibility of the village creating a Neighbourhood Plan. When anyone mentions a Neighbourhood Plan everyone immediately thinks about planning and development.... Its true that PART of creating a Neighbourhood plan is to create a strategy for development in the village... but it is so much more than this. A Neighbourhood plan is a way of developing a shared vision for our village which would include influencing the planning. At the February meeting the Councillors agreed to take the first steps to investigating whether a neighbourhood plan would be right for Ninfield. A drop in session is being organised, please watch the notice boards. Facebook and the website for more information. The Parish Council will need people in the village to help, for example delivering questionnaires, reading documents, researching information If you are able to to offer any time, no time is too little then please contact the clerk, ninfieldpc@btinternet.com or tel: 07725 843505 for more information

OOE HISTORY SOCIETY Our thanks to John Cheshire, from Ninfield History Society, for giving us his very interesting talk on Ashburnham Place, in January. Following on from that, Ian Everest visited us with

his talk "From the Sussex ox to the Fordson Major" in February. Ian is always a popular speaker wherever he goes and never fails to entertain.

The problem is, who do you get to follow him? Well, how about Geoff Hutchinson with his talk on Rudyard Kipling, another fine speaker. Geoff is due to visit us on Thursday 21st March at 7.30 p.m. in the village hall. Last time Geoff visited us he went out back to change into costume with a few people in the hall and when he came back out he was met with a sea of faces. We are looking forward to another thoroughly entertaining evening with him.

My DID YOU KNOW this time is quite lengthy so I have split it into two. It is a report on games of cricket between Ninfield and Hooe dated Tuesday 5th October, 1858, from the Sussex and Kent Provincial News and is repeated here, as written in the language of the day.

NINFIELD. Cricket. "Set to Verse".

We have received from an unknown correspondent - whom we can only conclude to be Poet Laureate to the Ninfield and Hooe Cricketers - a poetical account of a struggle or struggles between those Clubs. We scarcely know whether to style our correspondent's communication as "heroic" verse, but in order to enable our readers to judge for themselves, we will - though unable to afford space for all - give a verse or two.

Verse 1.

A mach of crickett this year was played on Ninfeild crickett ground by Elven Gentelman of Hooe An Elven of Ninfield town. Hooe Gentelmen went up in stile their Oppoants for to beat. And when the Game was over they wer Obliedge for to retreat.

erse II details an adjournment to the "King's Arms," " a good super for to take," and in Verse III the return match is described, wherein -

Seven wicketts the Hooe party were beat By Ninfield Gents Again.

On this occasion, as we are told in the fourth verse, the "Red Lion" was the evening rendezvous "a good repast to take" - and by the aid of "song and toast," and punch - " which flue and no mistake," the "hour of twelve arrived;"

the Ninfield Gents left in good part,

by wishing Hooe good by.

Unfortunately, however, whether owing to a re-actionary estimate of their own powers or to "potations pottle deep" - things were not fated to pass off so smoothly - and the poet tells us...

To be continued next time.

N HRISTIAN WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

We are not just open to welcome members, husbands and speakers but we had two lovely dogs that were at the centre of our talk in February together with four volunteers from 'Hearing Dogs for Deaf People'.

Sally Watson and friends, with Ki, a dachshund/poodle and Meg, a working cocker spaniel, each told their stories of gradual hearing loss causing vertigo, sudden trauma which brought on deafness and born with deafness. All very distressing stories of depression, isolation, missing out on conversation, music, having to register someone to talk on the phone to companies and unable to hear traffic, only some of the unseen problems of deaf people. The dogs are their life savers and their best companions, alerting their owners of alarms and danger with a nudge or an action. The dogs are matched to their would-be owners early on and if they find themselves compatibly, the dogs are particularly trained to suit the needs of their owner.

The statistics of deafness is staggering. In 2015 11 million suffered with hearing loss but this is expected to rise by 2035 to 15.6 million which is 1 in 5.

This will be a huge cost to the NHS but comparing a ratio of spending of £19.79 on Cardiovascular treatment, £11.35 on sight related treatment, only £1.11 is proportioned to hearing! Hearing Dogs for Deaf People is a charity that has no Government Funding so volunteers are happy to give these talks and offer ideas of how to help. Amazing trainers give a total commitment too, to see that the dogs do a fantastic job to vulnerable people.

Next month, Roger Thomas, will reminisce about his time broadcasting in Hong Kong in his talk 'From Idi Amin to Neddy Seagoon'. Please come along at our regular slot of the second Wednesday afternoon in the month at the Methodist Church Hall in Ninfield.


